Zotero—Getting Started

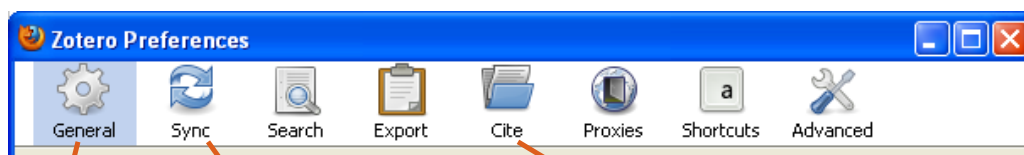


For full functionality, register for an online account, then download either Zotero for Firefox or Zotero Standalone

Crucial Set-up Tidbits:



Click on the “gear” icon to set up your preferences



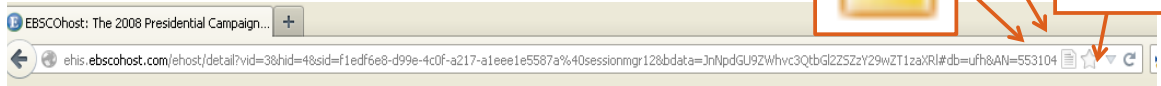
Check all Miscellaneous and Group Boxes

Enter Username and Password, make sure to check “Synch automatically”

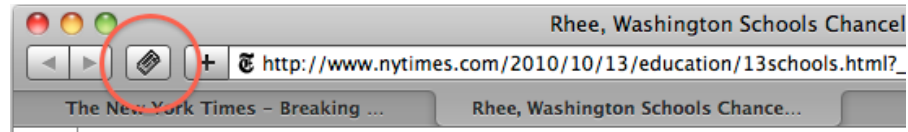
Get additional citation styles (e.g. Bluebook)

Save citations to Zotero

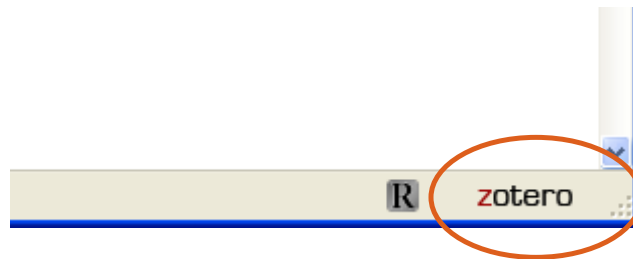

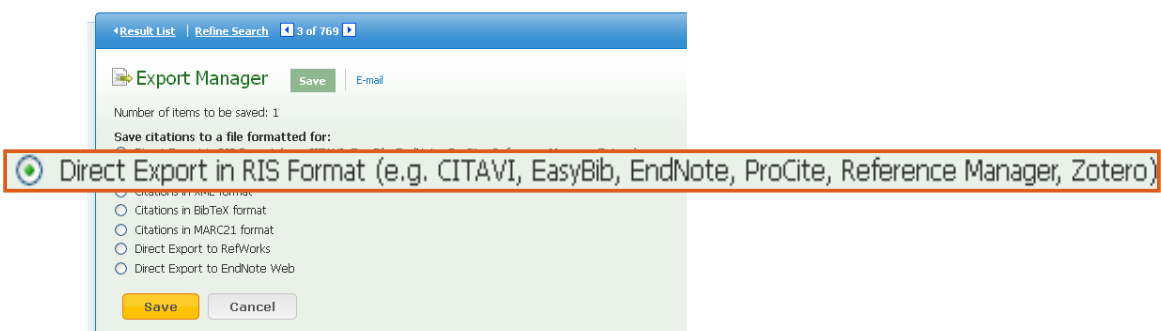

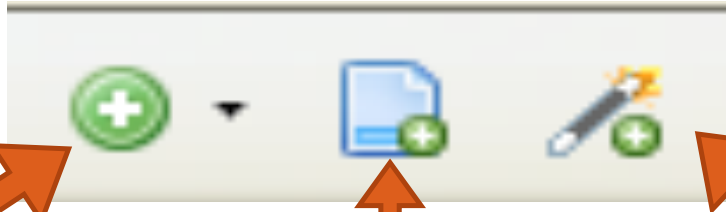
To Open Zotero pane in Firefox:

Add manually

Type in all data:

- Title
- Author
- Publisher
- Etc.

Save webpage that you're on

Saves

- URL
- Snapshot of page

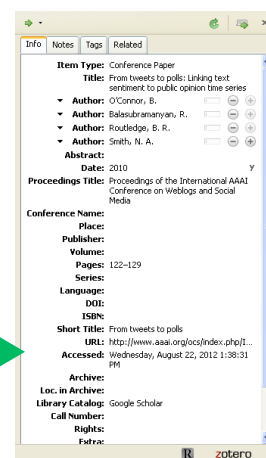
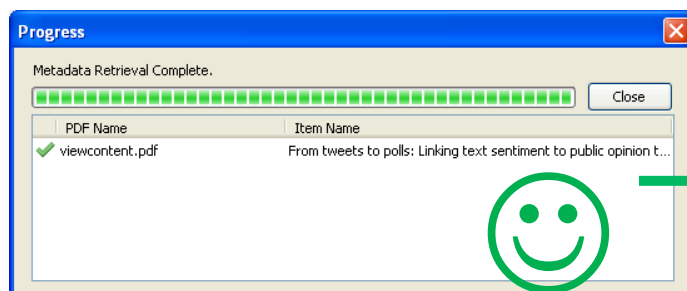
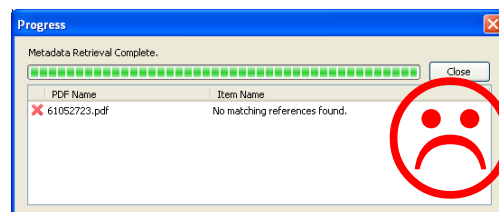
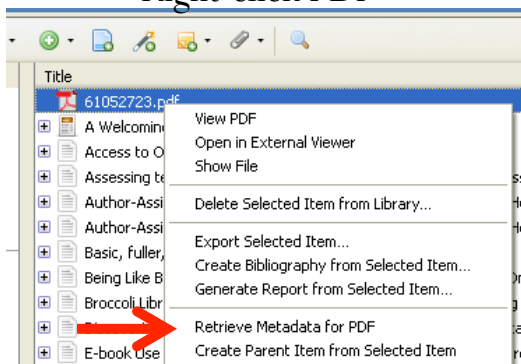
Enter other data manually

Add by identifier

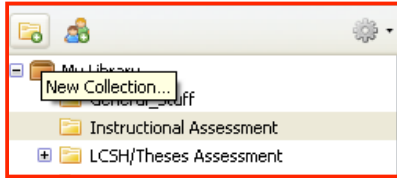
- ISBN

Add PDFs to Zotero

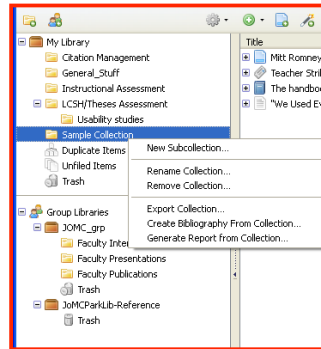
Drag PDF into Library
Right-click PDF



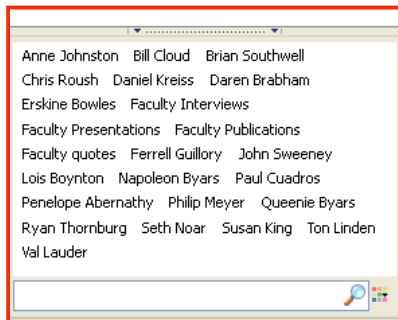
Organize your Citations in Zotero



Click on Folder Icon to create new collection



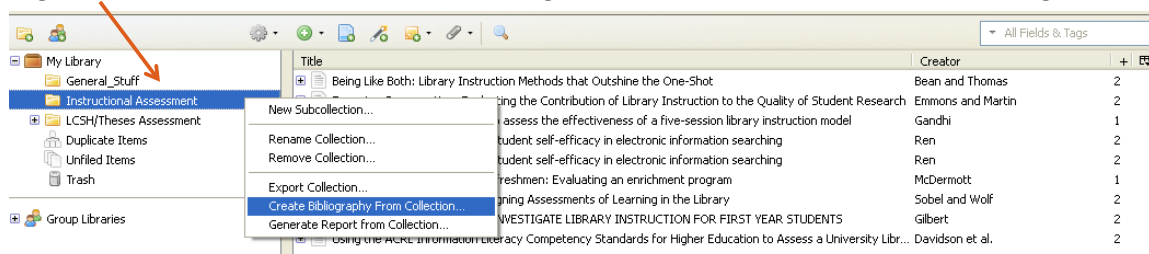
Right-click on folder to create sub-collection



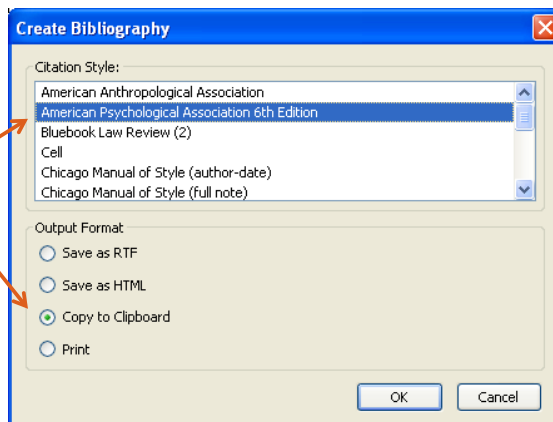
View and search tags in bottom left corner of Zotero pane (Double-click dotted line if you don't see tags!)

Create a Bibliography from Zotero

Right-click on a collection or on a single item, then select "Create bibliography".



Select the citation style and format, then click OK



Voila! A bibliography!
